Graduates of the ICGP can use the post-nominals GradGNZ and/or GradCG and can progress to Associate once the minimum work experience requirements are met.

Associateship
with GNZ and CGI

The first level of Chartered Membership. Associate members use the post-nominals AGNZ and/or ACG with the professional designation of Chartered Secretary (CS) or Chartered Governance Professional (CGP).

Fellowship
with GNZ and CGI

The highest level of Chartered Membership. Fellow members use the post-nominals FGNZ and/or FCG with the professional designation of Chartered Secretary (CS) or Chartered Governance Professional (CGP).

International Chartered Governance Programme Course Exemptions

Law and Finance Professionals

If you are a practising lawyer or accountant, you may be eligible for up to four course exemptions.

Other law and finance professionals may also be eligible for a reduction in study requirements based on qualifications and experience.

MBA and EMBA Graduates (NZ)

If you are a graduate of a New Zealand MBA or EMBA programme you will qualify for up to three course exemptions.

Other Governance Professionals

A background in broad company secretarial or governance professional responsibilities could also entitle you to some reduction in study.

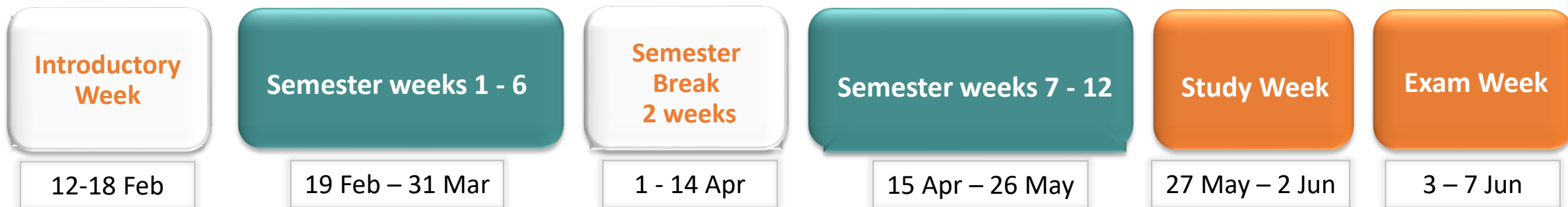
It is recommended students set aside **200 study hours per course** across the semester for course-work requirements (readings, tutorials, assessment). This equates to about **13hrs/wk/course**.

Successful course completion requires: an overall mark of at least 50% AND no less than 50% in the examination.

International Chartered Governance Programme 2024 Fees

2024 Student Fees (includes 15% GST)

- Initial application fee = \$ 150 (a one-off fee)
- Annual Student membership = \$ 300
- Course fee = \$ 1,950 per course

Prices vary but allow \$ 120 – 170 per course.*
