



Category 3: MĀORI or PASIFIKA GOVERNANCE LEADER

This award recognises a woman who is acknowledged as an experienced and reputable governance leader. This category is only open to women who identify as being of Māori or Pacific ethnicity. The nominee can represent any field and industry sector.

Information Required

- 1. Personal Statement and completed Questionnaire
- 2. Governance Curriculum Vitae (no more than 3 pages)
- 3. Completed and signed Application Form

Statement & Questionnaire

Personal Statement:

Provide a summary of how you are providing governance leadership to your peers and/or ethnic community that is achieving successful outcomes, what you are doing to advance your own governance career, why you consider diversity to be important to your organisation and how this aligns with your values, and why you believe you are recognised as a Māori or Pasifika diversity leader. Explain how this summary reflects the Vision and Mission of Women on Boards. (Maximum 1,000 words)

Question One:

What value are you adding to the organisation that you represent and/or to Māori or Pasifika communities? Provide examples that demonstrate this. (Maximum 500 words)

Question Two:

Over the next 12 months, what training and/or experience do you plan to undertake to further your governance career? What skills do you expect to gain from this training that will assist your governance journey? (Maximum 500 words)

Question Three:

What are your leadership and governance goals for the next 12 months, and where do you see yourself in five years' time? (Maximum 500 words)
